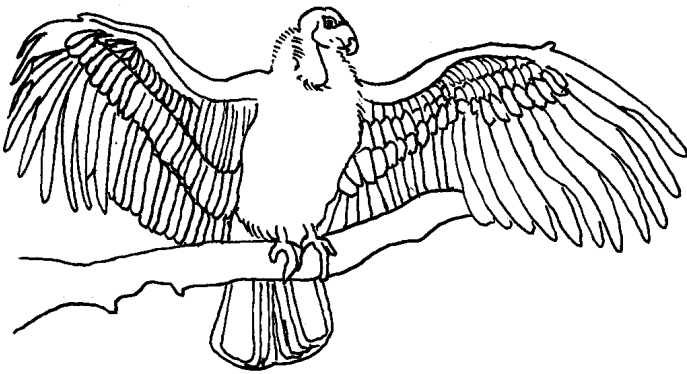

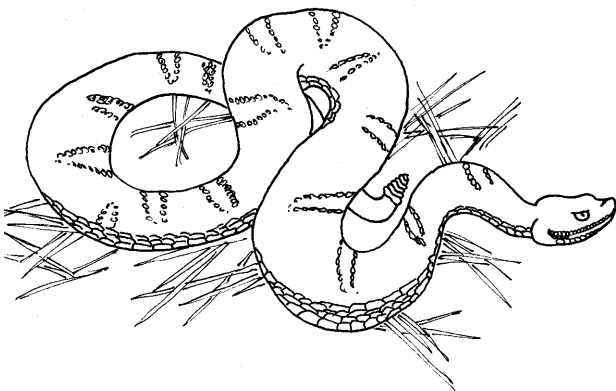

Endangered animals are animals that are in danger of becoming extinct. **Extinct** means gone forever - no more anywhere in the world.

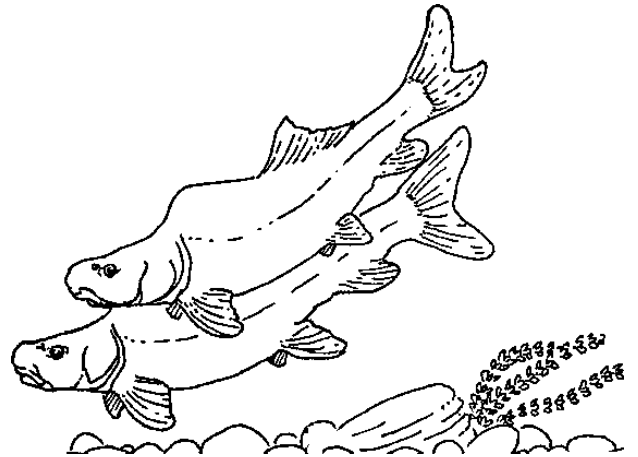
A **threatened** animal is one that is likely to become endangered in the future.

The main reason animals become endangered is because of **loss of habitat**. Habitat is the place where an animal lives and finds its food, water, and shelter.

If an animal's habitat is changed, it may not be able to find the food, water, and shelter it needs to survive.

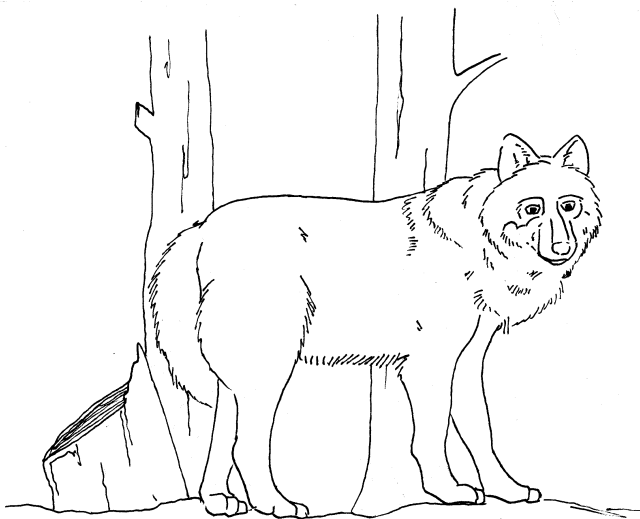
